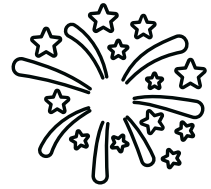


A Festival for Frogs

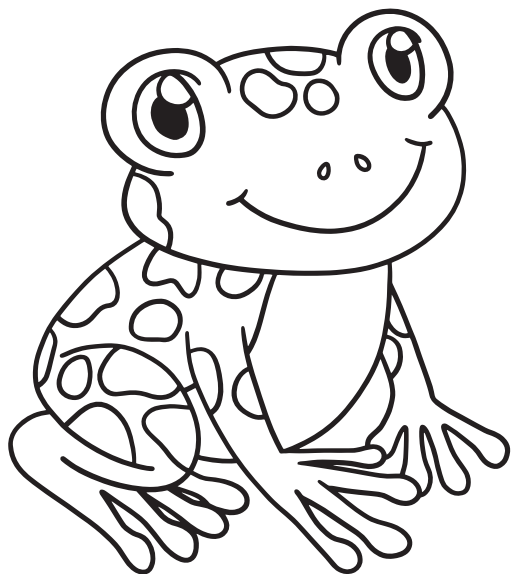
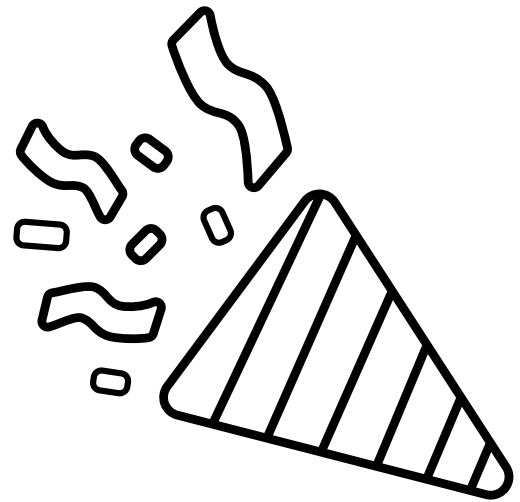


Read this poem and follow the instructions on the back
