# Robot Halloween

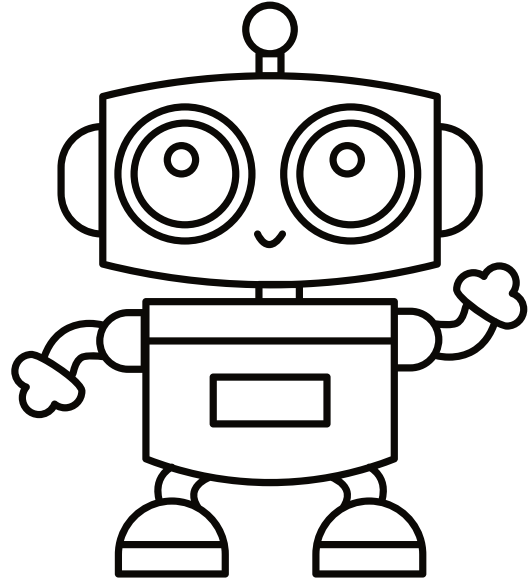
Read this poem and answer the questions on the back

it started spraying out the door.



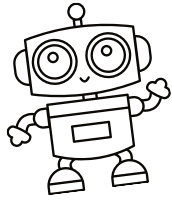
An avalanche of candy poured
