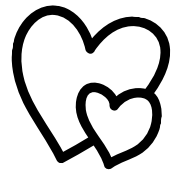




# My Brother's in Love with His Mirror



Read this poem and answer the questions on the back

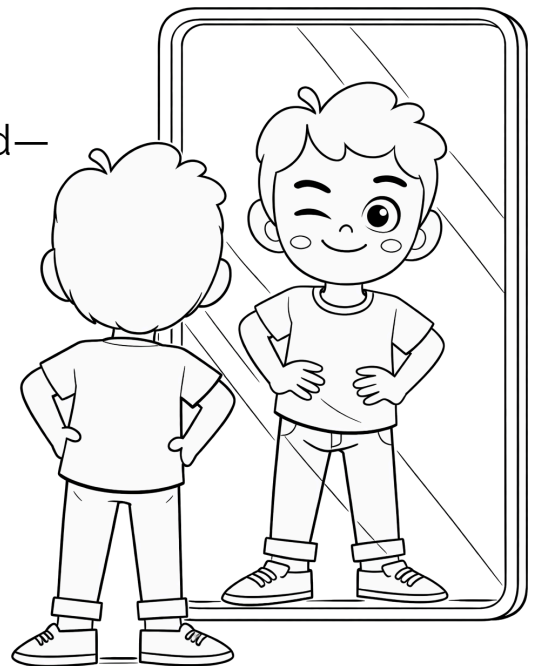
My brother is falling in love with his mirror.

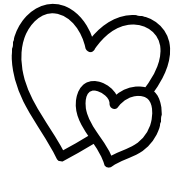
